ENGLISH

Spelling/Writing: Complete Unit 15 in your "Exploring Spelling" book. This unit is all about "Procedure Writing". Procedures are written to explain how something is done, in a series of sequenced steps...e.g. Recipes, directions on how to play a game, how to assemble flat packed objects, how to get something done etc.

If you like you could do some procedural writing using some of the words in this unit. I have 2 examples of procedures below.

You could explain how to make your favourite sandwich...how to play your favourite game...describe how you made something (e.g. A piece of art). Use the two examples to guide you.

Reading/Comprehension: For the next few weeks, until we return to school we will be using a book called "Better English"

We have to access this book online at www.educateplus.ie. There is free access to all books on this site.

Just click on the free resources – primary – then go to Better English 1st Class – view on screen eBook.

We will be working on units 8 and 15 of this book...one unit per week. There is a short piece of text at the start of each unit and then some work (comprehension, grammar etc.) about the text. You can also listen to the text using the "Audio" button. If you double click on the text it will magnify for you.

Unit 8 "Icing Bun Fun" (pages 25 – 27). I picked this unit because it has a little procedure in it. Maybe you could try it out!

Try to do **at least** one exercise from each page into your copy. Some exercises can be done orally.

Unit 11 "The King's New Clothes" (pages 34 – 36). This is an example of Narrative writing" which we have also done this year. Narrative writing is imaginative and usually has a problem and a solution.

Again, try to do **at least** one exercise from each page into your copy. Some exercises can be done orally.

We will aim to cover 4 pages per week (pages 1 – 4 this week and pages 5 – 8 next week). The characters in this book are all new to us but the language is more or less the same! Small World:

Week 1

Magnets (Science): pages 78/79. Complete the exercises on these pages. Don't worry if you don't have any magnets...you can do these pages some other time. Fridge magnets should work for these exercises if you have any.

Interesting facts about magnets:

- Magnetism can attract magnetic objects or push them away. Some of the basics of magnetism, which children might discover by exploring are:
 - ✓ North poles repel north poles
 - ✓ South poles repel south poles
 - ✓ North poles attract south poles
 - ✓ South poles attract north poles
- Magnets strongly attract steel, iron, nickel, cobalt.
- The strength of a magnet varies at different locations on the magnet. Magnets are strongest at their poles.
- Magnets slightly repel water.
- Magnets are objects that produce an area of magnetic force called a magnetic field. Magnetic fields are invisible to the human eye.
- The Earth's core is believed to be a mix of iron and nickel, giving Earth its own magnetic field. Magnetic compasses use this magnetic field to help navigate in northern, southern, eastern and western directions.
- If you attach a bar magnet to a piece of wood and let it float in a basin of water, the magnet will gradually turn until its north pole points north

PROCEDURAL WRITING

How to Make Jelly

Ingredients: • Jelly • Water

What we need: • Kettle • Water • Litre Jug • Spoon • Bowl

Method:

1. Fill the kettle with water and bring to the boil.
2. Break up the jelly into small pieces.
3. Put the jelly pieces into the jug.
4. Pour the boiling water over the jelly in the jug.
5. Stir well until all the jelly has dissolved.
6. Pour into the bowl.
7. Leave in a cold place to set.
8. Put in a dish. Add cream or ice-cream. Taste.

Method:

1. Hold the hurley with your strong hand above your other hand.
