Temperature (Science): pages 94, 95. Complete the exercises on this page (pretend your kitchen and garden are the classroom and playground).

Extra information:

How does a thermometer work? A glass column contains mercury. Mercury expands when it is heated and contracts as it cools. As the temperature rises, so too does the mercury because it is expanding. We read the temperature from the scale marked on the outside of the column.

The North Pole/Arctic

- The name "Arctic" comes from a Greek word meaning "near the bear".
- There is no land at the North Pole, but there is a layer of ice around 1.8 to 2.7m thick. So, you can stand there (and Santa can have his home there).
- The North Pole is not in any country. It is considered part of international waters. The nearest land is around 700 miles away.
- All the lines of longitude meet at the North Pole. When you are standing on the North Pole, any direction you point to is south!
- The magnetic North Pole is different from the true North Pole.
- Winter temperatures average around minus 34°Celsius. In summer it is quite a bit warmer at 0°Celsius. This may sound pretty cold, but it is warmer than the average temperatures at the South Pole.
- The sun is always up during summer. It rises in March and sets in September. That's a really long day and night!

Africa

- The highest point in Africa is Mount Kilimanjaro in Tanzania at 5,895m high. The lowest point is Lake Asal in Djibouti at 153m below sea level
- Africa's largest country is Algeria, its smallest is the Seychelles (a chain of 115 islands in the Indian Ocean). The most populated country is Nigeria.
- The largest lake in Africa is Lake Victoria and the longest river is the Nile River, which is also the longest river in the world.
- Africa has a rich and varied wildlife including elephants, penguins, lions, cheetahs, seals, giraffes, gorillas, crocodiles and hippos.
- More than 1,000 languages are spoken across Africa.

Extra information:

Experiment – What's happening? Each of the glasses will have a different pitch when hit with the pencil. The glass with the most water will have the lowest pitch. The glass with the least water will have the highest pitch. Small vibrations are made when you hit the glass. This creates sound waves which travel through the water. More water means slower vibrations and a deeper pitch.


