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# SCHOOL NEWSLETTER OCTOBER 2018

### **FAILTE AR AIS**

A big welcome back to all of our students and staff for another school year.

We welcome seven new pupils to Mayo Abbey N.S.: Emily, Grace, Lauren, Matthew, Noah, Philip and Tristan have all joined us in Junior Infants. I hope that their time here in Mayo Abbey N.S. is happy and productive and that each one of them reaches their full potential.

There are now 80 children on roll in our school. This entitles us to 3 class teachers. An enrolment of 84 children is required for a 4<sup>th</sup> class teacher. We have 7 children in Sixth class to leave in June 2019. This means if we enrol 11 children for September 2019 we will have enough to appoint a 4<sup>th</sup> teacher. This will make a big difference in the school as it means that each teacher would then have two classes instead of three. We now have to consider accommodation for a 4<sup>th</sup> classroom...

## WALKING TO AND FROM SCHOOL

It is great to see so many children walking and striding to and from school. Children have been reminded at school to observe the rules of the road at all times, especially when crossing the road. It is important to regularly remind your children at home about the rules of the road. For their own safety children are also asked not to climb/walk on walls or through shrub beds on their way home. Public footpaths should be used at all times. Once children leave school grounds the school is no longer responsible for their safety.

### **GREEN FLAG**

The Green School Committee along with Mrs. Glynn and Ms. Shaw are resuming work on our 5<sup>th</sup> Green Flag for biodiversity. We hope to apply for this flag later in the school year. More information to follow at a later date.

#### **ACTIVE FLAG**

This year we will be taking part in the Active School Flag initiative. The aim of this initiative is to get more schools, more active, more often. It provides the school with a template to get more active in a fun and inclusive way. Research proves that active children focus and concentrate better, enjoy school more and present fewer behavioural difficulties, so an energised school day has educational as well as health benefits. Mr. Clarke is our Active School Flag Coordinator and he is taking charge of getting us active!

To start, we have registered for the "Tour of Europe" challenge. This involves running/walking to a chosen destination in Europe. At the moment we are on our way to Dublin. We will be doing laps of the pitch and each two laps that a child completes equates to 1km of the journey. Once we reach Dublin we will be visiting famous landmarks such as Big Ben, the Eiffel Tour, Leaning Tower of Pisa etc. we will have well-travelled children by the end of our Tour!

- Children in the senior room took part in the mini 7's football blitz recently in Bekan. While they didn't progress to the next round they acquitted themselves quite well in all their games.
- Readathon: We are again taking part in the READATHON initiative (All classes). This is a voluntary
  activity and all monies raised through sponsorship go to MS IRELAND. We would encourage all
  children to take part and read regardless of whether they collect sponsorship or not.
- Futsal: A team of 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> class boys and girls will take part in a Futsal competition in Breaffy in the coming weeks
- Some of the children in the senior classes will take part in a football blitz in Balla Secondary School later in the month.
